Dear hockey club members and families,

Are you ready for our second season in the fabulous home of the Lizard Heads, the Hanley Rink in Town Park? Enclosed you will find registration information for the upcoming season. There will be a few changes. We believe all are for the better and over the course of the season we will again provide a safe and fun atmosphere for your child to learn and enjoy the great sport of ice hockey under the guidelines of USA Hockey, the Colorado Amateur Hockey Association, our league affiliation by-laws, and the Town of Telluride Parks and Recreation Department.

This year we have added a Girls U12 team that will play in the Mountain States Girls Hockey League. We are all very excited about this team with many bright prospects ready to take Telluride Hockey onto the statewide hockey stage. Good luck girls.

In summary, you will notice a practice schedule that is similar to last year with a few changes to accommodate our new team and better utilize the big sheet ice. Competition will again happen on weekends and generally will be as in years past. Year-end tournaments and playoffs will wrap up the season by the weekend of March 12, 2006 for most teams. A team that qualifies for the State tournament by winning the league title will play the weekend of March 18. Please see all the important dates on page 5 of this guide. Due to the expected growth in membership we must limit the registration for a child to one team or age group. Movement from one team to another is possible after registration with the approval and recommendation of the appropriate coaches and in accordance with any league, state or national rules governing player movement.

The intent of the hockey club is to field one team in each competitive age group this year. Our mite program will be conducted with all the kids from birth years 1997-2000 sharing ice for practice and competing in groups of similar skill. Our competitive teams will be limited to 20 players and they will play in the following USAHOCKEY age groups: Squirt, Peewee, Bantam, Midget, Girls U19 and Girls U12. Our hockey club has made a tremendous commitment to field a competitive team in each of our affiliate leagues. **Our mission of providing a fun hockey opportunity for all kids who wish to play remains our highest priority.** Should it become necessary, the Lizard Head Hockey Club reserves the right in their sole discretion, to place players of any age or gender on the team that the hockey club board of directors and the appropriate coaches feel is most appropriate in order to maintain the integrity, viability and manageability of any of our hockey teams. Other changes and important information for each team or age group is presented below.

Parent Education Program

A new requirement of all CAHA member families is a required on-line registration. This registration will begin a series of on-line letters and media related to hockey player parental education. The registration is easy and done at www.cahacares.com. **All families must be registered no later than November 30th**. Our online registrations will be monitored and **families not registered by November 30, 2005 risk the suspension of their player's eligibility**. Please take the very small amount of time required to meet this important requirement.

Hockey Club and Town of Telluride Parks and Recreation Partnership

The Hockey Club and the Parks and Recreation Department have enjoyed a long running and very successful partnership in providing the youth hockey program. In general, Parks and Recreation provide the management and maintenance of the ice facility, serve as the registrar, schedule competition and, arrange for officiating. The hockey club provides the organization structure for the promotion of our program, arranges for the training and certification of our coaching staff, organizes and conducts fund raising, provides league affiliation representatives and provides for the strategic direction and planning for the Telluride hockey program.

Girl's Hockey

Girl's hockey is for girls who have birth years 1986 - 1996. We will register two girl's teams. One team will be a U12 (1993-1996) and they will play a full schedule in the MSGHL. The other team will be a U19 team that will also play a full schedule in the MSGHL. On ice with the U12 will be Joe Distefano and on ice with the U19 will be Craig Hesse and Michael Ward.

Age will not be the sole determinate in competition match-ups. Preferably, and when the numbers allow, we will try to create ability based competitions. 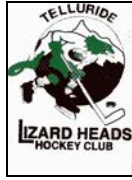

- I will do my very best to make youth sports fun for my child.
- I vow not to insult, cuss at, holler at, spit upon, body slam, or otherwise abuse a coach, referee, zamboni operator, scorekeeper, team mom, player, fan, or another parent.
- I will place the emotional and physical well being of my child ahead of a personal desire to win.
- I will insist that my child play in a safe and healthy environment.
- I will support coaches and officials working with my child, in order to encourage a positive and enjoyable experience for all.
- I will demand a sports environment for my child that is free from drugs, tobacco and alcohol and will refrain from their use at all youth sports events
- I will remember that the game is for youth - not adults.
- I will ask my child to treat other players, coaches, zamboni operators, and officials with respect regardless of race, sex, creed or ability.
- I will do my best to make sure that my young athlete arrives at practices and games on time and that he or she has all the necessary equipment and protective gear. If my kid has to miss a game, I'll call the day before.
- I will be supportive after games, win or lose. I will recognize good effort, teamwork and sportsmanship.

Waiver of Liability, Release Assumption of Risk & Indemnity Agreement

It is the purpose of this agreement to exempt, waive and relieve releasees from liability for personal injury, property damage, and wrongful death, including if caused by negligence, including the negligence, if any, of releasees. "Releasees" include USA Hockey, Inc., its affiliate associations, local associations, member teams, event hosts, other participants, coaches, officials, sponsors, advertisers, and each of them, their officers, directors, agents and employees.

For and in consideration of the undersigned participant's registration with USA Hockey, Inc., its affiliates, local associations and member teams (all referred to together as USAH) and being allowed to participate in USAH events and member team activities, participant (and the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of participant, if applicable) waive, release and relinquish any and all claims for liability and cause(s) of action, including for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death occurring to participant, arising out of participation in USAH events, member team activities, the sport of ice hockey, and/or activities incidental thereto, whenever or however they occur and for such period said activities may continue, and by this agreement any such claims, rights, and causes of action that participant (and participant's parent(s) or legal guardian(s), if applicable) may have are hereby waived, released and relinquished, and participant (and parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) does(do) so on behalf of my/our and participant's heirs, executors, administrators and assigns.

Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) acknowledge, understand and assume all risks relating to ice hockey and any member team activities, and understand that ice hockey and member team activities involve risks to participant's person including bodily injury, partial or total disability, paralysis and death, and damages which may arise therefrom and that I/we have full knowledge of said risks. These risks and dangers may be caused by the negligence of the participant or the negligence of others, including the "releasees" identified below. These risks and dangers include, but are not limited to, those arising from participating with bigger, faster and stronger participants, and these risks and dangers will increase if participant participates in ice hockey and member team activities in an age group above that which participant would normally participate in. I/We further acknowledge that there may be risks and dangers not known to us or not reasonably foreseeable at this time. Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) acknowledge, understand and agree that all of the risks and dangers described throughout this agreement, including those caused by the negligence of participant and/or others, are included within the waiver, release and relinquishment described in the preceding paragraph. I/We agree to abide by and be bound under the rules of USA Hockey, including the By-Laws of the corporation and the arbitration clause provisions, as currently published. Copies are available to USA Hockey members upon written request.

Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) acknowledge, understand and assume the risks, if any, arising from the conditions and use of ice hockey rinks and related premises and acknowledge and understand that included within the scope of this waiver and release is any cause of action (including any cause of action based on negligence) arising from the performance, or failure to perform, maintenance, inspection, supervision or control of said areas and for the failure to warn of dangerous conditions existing at said rinks, for negligent selection of certain releasees, or negligent supervision or instruction by releasees.

If the law in any controlling jurisdiction renders any part of this agreement unenforceable, the remainder of this agreement shall nevertheless remain enforceable to the full extent, if any, allowed by controlling law. This agreement affects your legal rights, and you may wish to consult an attorney concerning this agreement.

Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) agree if any claim for participant's personal injury or wrongful death is commenced against releasees, he/she shall defend, indemnify and save harmless releasees from any and all claims or causes of action by whomever or wherever made or presented for participant's personal injuries, property damage or wrongful death.

Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) acknowledge that they have been provided and have read the above paragraphs and have not relied upon any representations of releasees, that they are fully advised of the potential dangers of ice hockey and understand these waivers and releases are necessary to allow amateur ice hockey to exist in its present form. Significant exclusions may apply to USA Hockey's insurance policies, which could affect any coverage. For example, there is no liability coverage for claims of one player against another player. Read your brochure carefully and, if you have any questions, contact USA Hockey or a District Risk Manager.
